## RESUMPTION OF

### SUNDAY MORNING MASSES

## PUBLIC HEALTH REGULATIONS

As the number of Covid-19 cases continues to rise exponentially, last Wednesday 14th October, the Northern Ireland Executive announced additional interventions, concerning social life and religious worship

- Churches will remain open and liturgy may continue subject to the guidance in place.
  - It will now be mandatory for face coverings to be worn when entering and exiting the church. This is in addition to the Church leader's recommendation, endorsed by the Diocese, that face coverings be worn all times while in the Church.
  - Attendance at funerals is to be limited to 25 persons, with no pre-or post-funeral gatherings.
  - From Monday 19th October 2020, attendance at weddings is to be limited to 25 persons.
  - Bubbling to be limited to a maximum of 10 people from two households;
  - No overnight stays in a private home unless in a bubble;
  - Work from home unless unable to do so;
  - No unnecessary travel should be undertaken.
  - The half term holiday break for schools and colleges will be extended to a two-week break to run from 19th to 30th October.
- It is Important that we all play our part in curbing the virus. Any parishioners currently waiting on the results of a Covid-10 test should be isolation and not attending Mass
